The objective-The goal is to provide students with comprehensive skill development training, boosting employability and contributing to the larger goal of developing a competent workforce. Integrating SMART and FICSI at Jaysingpur College corresponds with this goal, equipping students for a variety of professional jobs.

The context-Spandan Education Society, a division of Sharanprabha Bahuuddeshiya Sanstha, is a registered SMART training center, offering courses with five different roles. Jaysingpur College, a Kolhapur district member, engages with FICSI on comparable training programs under the PMKUYA Scheme.

Evidence of success -Accreditation certificates authenticate program completion, attendance papers demonstrate student participation, on-field images reflect practical application and skill improvement, and fund distribution follows government guidelines.

Problems encountered and solution- Due to the limited initial infrastructure, improved facilities for practical training were required. Early on, logistical issues in resource allocation for equitable distribution occurred. Strategic planning was required for successful communication and promotion, as well as encouraging student participation. Infrastructure was improved as a result of collaborative stakeholder initiatives. A methodical resource allocation strategy assured optimal usage. Improved communication tactics, such as awareness campaigns, increased participation.

1. Training centres must be fully accredited on SIP and empaneled on MSSDS Portal.
2. TP shall conduct proper counselling of the candidates prior and after mobilization and maintain records of the same.
3. The TP shall make all efforts to mobilize eligible and competent candidates who are interested with an eye on achieving high placement records.
4. The TP shall plan and execute the training in a planned manner so as to complete the batch training, assessment and placement within the Job Role stipulated timelines.
5. The TP shall conduct the training as per District Skill Development Plan in coordination with the District Skill Committee
6. TP shall register the mobilized candidates on SIP and MSSDS Portal.
7. The TP shall do branding and publicity of training as per scheme guidelines.

9. TP shall conduct post placement tracking as per scheme guidelines.

11. TP shall coordinate with FICSI and insure to complete assessment within stipulated time mentioned in the relevant scheme guidelines.



12. TP shall share monthly report of placement of the trained candidates to FICSI on or before the 3rd of every month without fail irrespective of whether any placement is done or not.
13. The TP shall provide to FICSI tracking of placement of trained candidates.
14. TP shall assist FICSI in the impact assessment at the completion of this work order.
15. Training must be started only for those batches which are approved by MSSDS on Mahaswayam Portal.
16. TP will ensure that mobilization of the beneficiaries is completed and candidates registered on MSSDS Portal before the 15th of May, 2022 in coordination with FICSI.

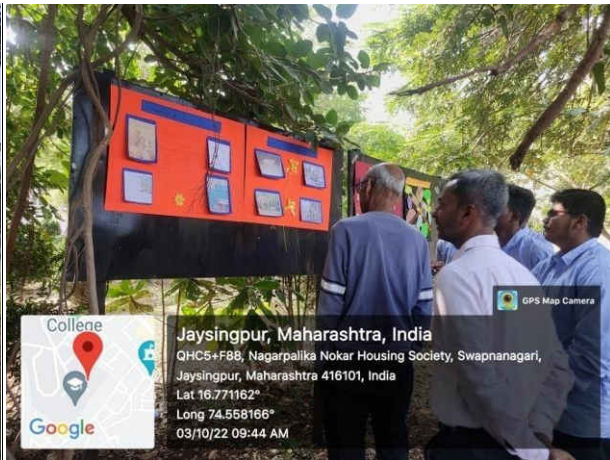

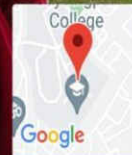

Visit area:

As per syllabus our Zoology department arranged short study tour of B. Sc I to visit butterfly garden. As per the plan tour was arranged on 16 march 2023. The study tour was headed by Dr. S. R. Patil sir. Jaysingpur College Jaysingpur has developed Butterfly garden in 700 M² areas. In this garden specific host plants and nectar plants have been planted.

Introduction:

Butterflies are colorful, flying beauty on the earth. Due to their beautiful color patterns they have got aesthetic value. These are also considered as good environmental indicators as they relied on specific floral diversity. Butterflies play an important role in the ecosystem. These are represented as primary consumers in the ecological pyramids as both adults and caterpillar stages are eaten by secondary consumers like Lizards, birds, Frogs, toads, snakes etc. Even some parasites attack on the pupa of butterflies. Beside all these natural obstacles butterflies can successfully complete their lifecycle. Higher reproduction increases the rate of survival might be the key success of these tiny creatures. This strategy will help them to combat mortality rate.

As we all know that lifecycle of butterfly is completed mainly in four stages.

1. Eggs
2. Caterpillar
3. Pupa and
4. Adult

Eggs: Eggs are tiny; vary in color, round/cylindrical/oval in shape. These eggs are laid on the surface of leaves or stem along with sticky material so the eggs can firmly attach to the substratum. These eggs have very less amount of nutrients in it. Hence they get hatched to give rise to caterpillars.

Caterpillar/ Larva: Caterpillar hatched out from the small tiny eggs usually lasts up to one month. The time period of this stage varies species to species. These larvae will feed upon

leaves of plants. Individual species feed upon very specific plant and such plants are called host plants. Some of the caterpillars also feed on flowers of plants.

Pupa: It is the life stage of butterfly when it encloses itself in case called Chrysalis during metamorphosis. This stage lasts from few days to many months. Sometimes emergence of adult from the may get delayed as it is environmental drive.

Adult: This is the final stage of butterfly lifecycle. Adult butterflies are colorful and have aesthetic value. These mainly feed upon nectar of flowers. The life span of adults is very short and lasts up to one or two weeks. Once males mate with female immediately they die and female also die after laying eggs.

Hence, on the basis of its lifecycle butterflies require two types of plants, namely, Host plants and Nectar plants. As host plants are specific, detailed study is needed during the introduction host plants as per the status of butterfly diversity in particular area. However, butterfly do not relay on specific nectar plants so nectar plants are selected randomly.

2022-2023

As per syllabus Department of Zoology has arranged study tour to Malvan, Tarkarli and Vengurla on 12th and 13th February 2023. As per the instructions given by the faculty members we all gathered on Jaysingpur bus stand at 06:30 am and moved towards Malvan.

Sindhudurg

Our journey continued to reach Sindhudurg and reached there at 01:00 pm. We went there to see the fort by boating. The fort was built by Hiroji Indalkar (Deshmukh). It is the Shivaji's Master Architect built in 1664 within 3 years. It is spread over the area of 48 Acres with 2-3 mile long rampart and wall is 30 feet high and 12 feet thick. It is one of the historical place and tourist place. Due to high tide we did not observe any aquatic animals.

After this we went to fish market around the beach. This market is famous for various sea animals. Here, we observed different fishes like Pomphret, Saw fish, Scoliodon, Sting ray. Along the fishes we also observe Loligo, Sepia, Star fish, Prawn, Squilla, Jelly fish, and crab etc.

1) Pomphret -

It is marine bony fish found in small shoals. It is used for food which is delicious and tasty having high food value and high protein; It is rich in Vit -A, Ca and Fe .

2) Loligo -(Squid)

Body is long and cylindrical, fins are short and are united .It belongs to Phylum - Mollusca and Class -Cephalopoda. Head is short and bears pair of large eyes and central mouth is surrounded by 10 arms, provided with sucker one of pair is elongated and bear sucker at free terminal end is called tentacle.

2) Sepia -(Cuttle fish)

It is marine Mollusca belongs to class Cephalopoda as head bear 5 pairs of arms and shell is internal. It lives in shallow water. Its foot is modified into arms and tentacles. Sepia show presence of ink glands used in offence and defense.

3) Prawn -

It is marine Crustacean, belonging to Phylum – Arthropoda . The body is formed 19 segments. Body is divisible into cephalothorax and abdomen. It is used as food due to its high nutritive value. Prawns are cultured artificially. Food prepared from Prawn is delicious and tasty.

4) Jelly fish – (Aurelia)

It is marine in habitat belongs to Phylum- Coelenterata and Class – Scyphozoa and Order – Semaestomeae. They show polymorphism, Medusa stage is dominant. It shows radial symmetry. Ploypoid phase is represented by small polyp which gives rise to medusa.

5) Crab -

The Crab belongs to Phylum – Arthropoda, Class – Crustacea, Order – Decapoda. The habitat is marine as well as fresh water, it is omnivorous. It is also having great food value.

6) Sting ray- It belongs to class chondrichthes. Stingrays are disk-shaped and have flexible, tapering tails armed, in most species, with one or more saw-edged, venomous spines. The dasyatid stingrays, also called whip-tailed rays and stingarees, inhabit all oceans and certain South American rivers. They have slim, often very long, whiplike tails.

7) Mackerel - The Indian mackerel is a species of mackerel in the scombrid family (family Scombridae) of order Perciformes. Mackerels are rounded and torpedo-shaped, with a slender, keeled tail base, a forked tail, and a row of small finlets behind the dorsal and anal fins. They are carnivorous fishes and feed on plankton, crustaceans, mollusks, fish eggs, and small fish.

8) Ribbon fish - The ribbonfish are any lampriform fishes in the family Trachipteridae. These pelagic fish are named for their slim, ribbon-like appearance. They have an elongated and compressed body, a very long dorsal fin, a large head, low pectoral fins, a mouth in advanced military elongated teeth.

9) Stiped bonito - Their body is elongated and very robust, characterized by a grayish color with dark tonalities. Their fins have small yellowish stripes, that spread to their tails. They can also have their bodies full of scales, depending mainly on how they are raised in the areas where they develop. Their chest and abdominal area, are more prominent than the rest of their body. They are very good swimmers; which often travel large areas of water at long distances.

11) Dian fish- *Bodianus diana*, is a species of wrasse native to the Indian Ocean from the African coast to the Nicobars and the Cocos-Keeling Islands. Hogfish (*Bodianus*) get their name from the way they look for food in the substrate using their snout.

12) Surmai fish- Packed with Omega-3 fatty acids, Surmai is one of the healthiest fishes available. Taking into account its large size, it is usually prepared in form of slices or steaks. Freshness Indicators : Intact & transparent eyes, firm texture, red gills & bright colour.

After this visit we went to stay place and had a nice dinner and rested. On next day we visited to Tarkarli beach here we enjoyed with lots of fun and observe many crabs and shells. After that we started our journey towards vengurla.

Vengurla

Here we visited regional fruit research station and saw varieties of fruit plantations. We were given a tour of the orchard by Dr. Bhingarde. We also visited a lab here where they explained how the insects are bred and cultivated to use in the process of saving plants and trees. We also observed the different types of pests on varieties of fruit plants. There are number of insect pests damaging mango tree but the most abundant and destructive are mango hoppers, mealy bug, stem borer, fruit fly, mango nut weevil and play a major role in bringing down the fruit quality and yield. There are no serious pests and diseases found in kokum plantation .However leaf miner and mealy bugs cause damage to tender leaves. The fruit plantation we observed there is as follows with their medicinal properties,

1. Mango - A mango is an edible stone fruit produced by the tropical tree *Mangifera indica*. They are a great source of magnesium and potassium, both of which are connected to lower blood pressure and a regular pulse. Mangoes are a good source of fiber and antioxidants, including vitamin C, which means they support a healthy immune system.

2. Kokam - *Garcinia indica*, a plant in the mangosteen family, commonly known as kokum. The kokum fruit is a powerhouse of rich nutrients. Kokum is packed with many essential vitamins such as vitamin A, vitamin B3, vitamin C and minerals such as calcium, iron, manganese, potassium, and zinc. It also contains a good amount of folic acid, ascorbic acid, acetic acid, hydroxy citric acid, and fibre. Kokam fruit is a natural coagulant and a glass of kokam juice gives us immense relief from the scorching heat in summers.

3. Betel Nut - Chewing betel nuts ensures healthy digestive system, eradicates indigestion, and helps restore appetite. Improved digestion eradicates constipation, and thus improves the overall health. is pungent, bitter, spicy, sweet, salty, and astringent. It was said to expel wind, kill worms, remove phlegm, subdue bad odors, and beautify the mouth.

4. Nutmeg/Jaiphala - Jaiphala is valued as a potent aphrodisiac, digestive stimulant, and essential oil easing the pain associated with headaches and treats common cold, cough and asthma.

5. Water Apple- Water apple is rich in Vitamin C and other phenolic compounds called flavonoids. These prevent the damage of cells due to free radicals, pollutants and toxic elements

6. Amla- Amla has antibacterial and anti-inflammatory properties. The phytonutrients and antioxidants in amla can benefit memory by fighting against free radicals that can attack and damage brain cells.

7. Black pepper - Black pepper is a good source of manganese, a mineral that can help with bone health, wound healing, and metabolism.

8. Cashew - Cashews are a wonderful source of healthy fats, including monounsaturated and polyunsaturated varieties. Cashews are low in sugar and rich in fiber, heart-healthy fats, and plant protein. They're also a good source of copper, magnesium

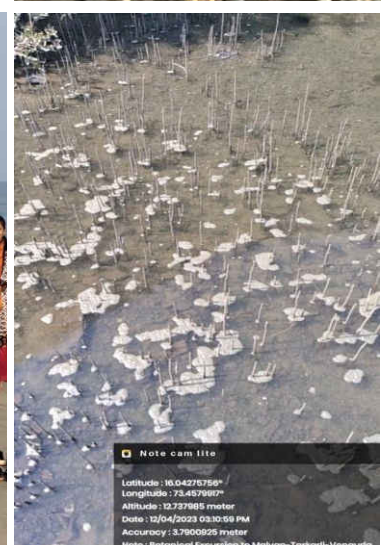
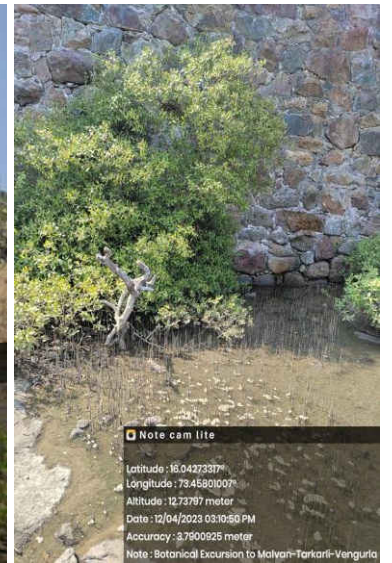

II Botany Curriculum, two day botanical excursions was organized to Malvan-Tarkarli-Vengurla by Department of Botany, Jaysingpur College Jaysingpur on 12th and 13th April, 2023 for botany students. A total 55 students and 05 teachers were participated in this botanical excursion. A group of B.Sc. II students were accompanied by Dr. Suraj Umdale and Miss. Sonali Langare of Botany department. The objective of study tour was to familiarize the students with the flora and ecology of the Konkan area of Western Ghats of Maharashtra and also know the Regional Fruit Research Station Vengurla.

We started our journey from central bus stand of Jaysingpur at 7:10 am. *via* Jaysingpur- Kolhapur- Gaganbawda- Malvan. The distance Between Jaysingpur to Malvan is 193 Km. We have reached Malvan at 12:30 pm. In Malvan, we visited visited Sindhudurg fort. Sindhudurg Fort is a historical fort present in the Arabian Sea, just off the coast of Maharashtra in Western India. The fort was built by Chhatrapati

Shivaji Maharaj. The fortress lies on the shore of Malvan town of Sindhudurg District in the Konkan region of Maharashtra.

On the fort we have recorded few plant species viz., *Cocos nucifera*, *Canavalia* sp., Mangrove species (*Avecinia* sps., *Rhizophora* sps.). After visiting fort, we reached fish market of Malvan at 5:00pm. The main attraction is fish market which is handled by local people. There we saw different types of fishes and other marine organisms. In evening, we visited the rock garden at Malvan and enjoyed the wonderful evening at rock garden with musical fountain. At the end of the day we stayed at the Tarkarli.

On the next day, 13th April, 2023 we started the journey towards Regional fruit research station Vengurla at 10:00 am. After 2 hours of travelling we reached at Regional Fruit Research Station, Vengurla on 12:10 pm. This institute is established in 1957 and aided by Dr. Balasaheb Sawant Konkan Krishi Vidyapeeth. The area cover of RFRS is 68.23 hector, which include Main Office building, Post-harvest technology wing, Soil water testing laboratory, and Plant Pathology laboratory, Plant Nursery, Cashew field gene bank, Mango farm, and Sourabh rest house.

First we visited the plant nursery and observed Mother Orchard Field of Michelia plants, Cinnamon, Beetle nut, Black pepper, Myristica, and Jam fruits. In this field we have also noticed the air layering technique of grafting (Gooty technique) on Cinnamon and Kokum plants. Further we visited to nursery where the saplings of different varieties of fruit plants and spices are available for sell.

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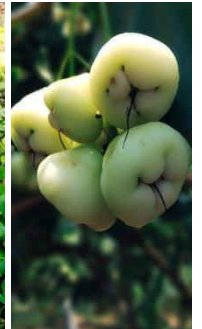

After nursery visit at Regional Fruit Research Station, we visited various Laboratories such as Plant Pathology laboratory, Soil water testing laboratory, Post-harvest technology wing. In plant pathology laboratory, we observed different equipment's like laminar flow, autoclave, centrifuge, pH metre, etc. the institute is actively involved in management of various disease of mango, cashew such as insect predators, insect parasites, and spider mites.

After plant pathology laboratory we visited Post-harvest technology department. The post-harvest technology department is under the supervision of In-charge Dr. R. T. Bhingarde. He gave information about the processing and packaging of mango pulp and Kokum. The post-harvest technology department has their own production unit. They manufacture and sell products like pickles of Jayphal, amla and mango, kokum syrup, amala syrup, mango pulp and powder of Aavala, kokam, Amsul, etc.

After visit and collection of the plants of botanical interest, we left Vengurle at 4:14 pm. On the same day we reach our return destination (Jaysingpur) at about 10.15 pm. The Botanical study tour increased our knowledge about nature, environment, lone and wealth of mind by receiving the ideas. The botanical study tour was successfully inculcated the practical knowledge various theoretical concepts of Botany and also get research exposure to the students. The students get a unique experience of field nursery and research laboratory at Regional Fruit Research Station, Vengurla. This botanical excursion was fruitful. We enjoyed this tour and also knew many plants in the nature.

VISIT TO PLANT NURSERY

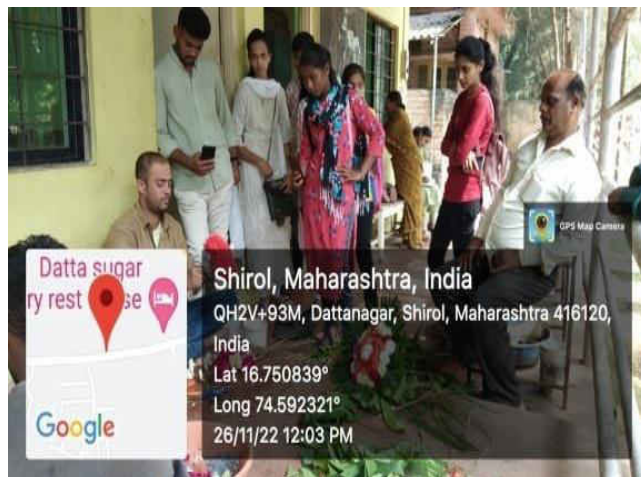
26th November, 2022

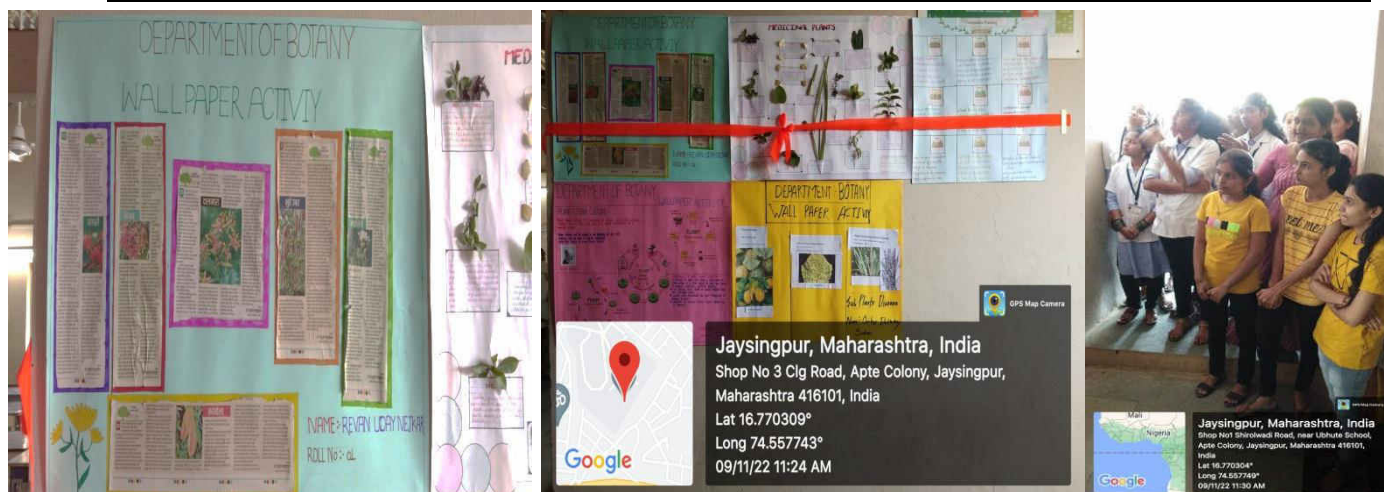

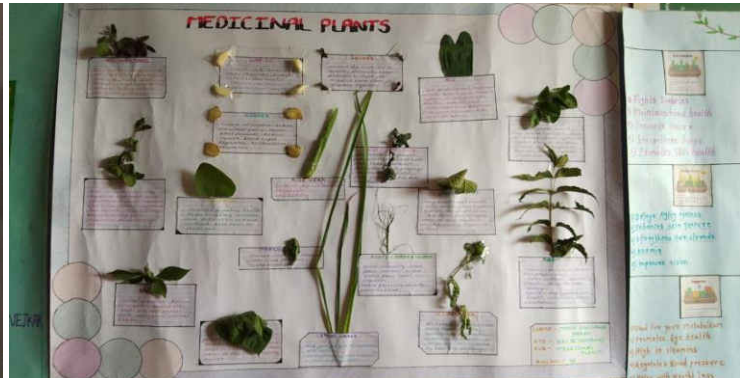
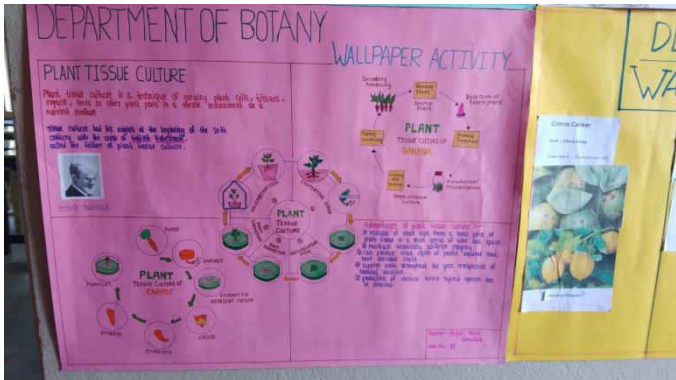
WALLPAPER ACTIVITY
